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## 1. LEGAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

These Conditions for Acceptance are those referred to in our General Terms and Conditions.

The lists of refused waste in certain categories mentioned in these Conditions for Acceptance are intended solely to clarify certain non-compliant types requiring particular attention from our customers. As such, they are not exhaustive and in no way replace the legal requirements in this area.

In accordance with the General Terms and Conditions, in the event of non-compliance with these Conditions for Acceptance, the service provider (hereinafter Bruxelles-Propreté Pro) reserves the right to refuse to empty the collection equipment concerned and/or to charge additional fees for the collection and processing of waste.

## A reminder concerning some of your legal obligations:

- Since 2 February 2013, any producer or holder of non-household waste (companies, selfemployed people, public authorities, non-profit organisations, etc.) that chooses to have its waste collected by a registered collector has been legally required to have a waste collection contract. It must also sort the paper and cardboard generated by its professional activity.
- Since 2 February 2014, the sorting of PMD, glass waste and green/garden waste has also been mandatory for professionals.
- Since 1 May 2023, shops and businesses have been required to sort their food or kitchen waste following the entry into force of a new European directive. They must also sort metal, wood, rigid plastics, styrofoam / expanded polystyrene, plastic strapping and plastic film other than PMD.
- From 1 January 2025, textile waste (clothing, fabrics, linen, etc.) must also be collected separately.

Please note that the above list of requirements is not exhaustive and in no way replaces the legal rules in this matter. It is intended to provide an overview of some of your obligations and cannot cover all the details or nuances of the legislation.



## 2. SORTING OF ORDINARY WASTE

## 2.1. PAPER AND CARDBOARD WASTE

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

## Waste authorized in the "Paper and cardboard waste" category:

Paper and cardboard waste originating from the normal running of a business, i.e. waste that is similar in nature and composition to waste originating from households.

- Envelopes, even with windows;
- ✓ Pure paper / cardboard;
- ✓ White paper / cardboard;
- ✓ Coloured paper / cardboard;
- Paper / cardboard with printed writing;
- Letter paper;
- Printer / photocopy paper;
- Cardboard boxes (washing powder boxes, cereal boxes, etc.);
- ✓ Medication leaflets;
- Cardboard tubes or cores (accepted if 'Cardboard' only);
- Metal-free cardboard folders / binders;

- ✓ Cardboard wrapping paper;
- ✓ Newspapers;
- ✓ Magazines;
- ✓ Leaflets;
- ✓ Advertising;
- ✓ Magazines / brochures;
- ✓ Books;
- ✓ Archives;
- ✓ Files;
- Paper bags;
- Cardboard packaging;
- Office paper.

## Waste refused in the "Paper and cardboard waste" category:

- 8 Tetrapaks;
- 8 Dirty boxes used to hold eggs, fish, etc.;
- 8 Burnt paper;
- 8 Wallpaper;
- Silicone paper;
- Oirty, soiled or greasy paper / cardboard;
- 8 Laminated paper / cardboard;
- 8 Baking paper;
- 8 Cellophane paper;
- 8 Carbon paper;
- 8 Wax paper;
- 8 Heat-resistant or thermal paper;
- ⊗ Metallised/aluminium paper;
- 8 Paper / bags with an aluminium layer;
- 8 Bread bags;
- Cardboard tubes or cores (refused in the "Paper and cardboard mix");
- 8 Telephone directories;
- ⊗ Wrapping paper with plastic;
- O Plasticised paper / cardboard;
- Solution Number Number Number Number

- 8 Cardboard with an inner plastic layer;
- 8 Adhesive masking tape / sticky tape;
- Folders / binders made of plastic or including metal;
- ⊗ Takeaway cardboard coffee cups;
- Honeycomb paper;
- Ø Paper towels;
- 8 Paper tablecloths, tissues and napkins;
- ⊗ Diapers / Nappies;
- Paper polluted by: oil, paint, paraffin or other chemicals;
- 8 Hazardous waste;
- 8 Medical waste;
- 8 Food waste / food;
- 8 Radioactive or explosive materials;
- 8 Any erotic content on paper or DVD;
- 8 Hard plastic;
- 8 Plastic film, bags and sacks
- ⊗ Textiles, clothing;
- 8 Toilet paper;
- 8 Photos.





## WHERE? Where should you put your waste?

## You can dispose of your "Paper and cardboard waste":

- In the yellow commercial / pro bag. Only if you have a yellow bag commercial contract with our Agency.
- In the yellow container. Only if you have a yellow container commercial contract with our Agency.
- At our Recypark accessible to professionals.
   See <u>rates</u>, rules and practical information in this document or on the website's <u>Recypark</u> page.

**HOW?** How should you present your waste?

Some rules for "Paper and cardboard waste":

- Paper and cardboard waste must be clean, dry, free from residue, free from plastic film.
- ☑ For the collection of paper and cardboard waste in bags, the use of bags other than the yellow commercial / PRO bag provided for this purpose is prohibited.
- ☑ Paper and cardboard waste may also be put out for collection in cardboard boxes. Paper and cardboard waste must not spill from the box that is used.
- Pieces of cardboard / newspapers that do not fit in the yellow commercial / PRO bag must be folded and tied securely. It is preferable to use cotton, hemp, jute or sisal string for this. Do not use plastic ties.
- ☑ As far as possible, remove stickers, tape or adhesive from cardboard before putting it out for collection.
- ✓ For the safety of the teams responsible for collection and for more efficient handling during collection rounds, ensure that the compacted cardboard bales and cardboard boxes are easy to handle and transport, i.e. of a reasonable size and weight. Use two medium-sized bales instead of one that is excessively large or heavy.
- ☑ Bag / bales / boxes should be a maximum of fifteen kilograms (15 kg).
- **I** For collection in containers, paper and cardboard waste must be placed loose in the container.
- ☑ To be accepted for collection, containers must be easy for our teams to handle. It is important to consider their weight and where to leave them. For example, a container that is too heavy, left on cobbles or gravel, or needs to be lifted off a curb may be impossible to collect, so pay attention to these details when preparing your containers for collection.



## 2.2. PMD PACKAGING

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

## Waste authorized in the "PMD packaging" category:

PMD packaging waste originating from the normal running of a business, i.e. waste that is similar in nature and composition to waste originating from households.

- Plastic packaging (P):
  - → **Bottles and flasks** (soft drinks, water, milk, juice, bath / laundry / dishwashing products, etc.);
  - $\rightarrow$  **Trays and containers** (clean or dirty, but emptied of their contents);
  - → **Pots, tubes and cups** (yoghurt / flower pots, coffee cups, toothpaste tubes, etc.);
  - → Films, bags and sachets (drinks packaging, crisp packets, aluminium bags, industrial films measuring 1 m<sup>2</sup> maximum, packaging of less than eight litres (8 I), etc.);
  - $\rightarrow$  **Drinks caps** (coffee caps, etc.).
  - $\rightarrow$  **Other** (100% plastic hangers).
- Metal packaging (M): cans, tins, aerosol cans (for food products, for cosmetics, etc.), drinks caps (coffee, etc.), metal lids, caps and capsules (for jars, bottles, etc.), metal containers, metal drums, aluminium plates, aluminium containers, aluminium trays, deodorisers, 100% metal hangers, etc.
- Drinks cartons (D): any laminated brick-shaped packaging containing liquid products (fruit juice, soup, milk, cream, etc.).

## Waste refused in the "PMD packaging" category:

- Multi-material hangers (plactic hangers + metal hook);
- 8 Hard plastic;
- Syringes, intravenous bags (Baxter bags) and other healthcare waste;
- Packaging with a capacity greater than eight litres (8 L) (cans, etc.);
- Large industrial films, covers/film for pallets and bags of more than 1m<sup>2</sup>;
- Strapping (industrial quantity);
- Objects that are not regarded as packaging or are too large: plastic buckets, water hoses, rubber boots, windcheaters, plastic crates, multi-sockets, coffee machines, plastic overshoes, plastic / nitrile gloves, etc.;
- Styrofoam / expanded polystyrene with small white EPS balls;
- Gas cylinders (butane, propane, helium, nitrous oxide, etc.);
- 8 Batteries (lithium, etc.);

- Packaging for pesticides, insecticides, herbicides, rat poison, defoamer;
- Packaging for oxidising agents, fuels, engine oils and lubricants;
- Packaging for glues, paints, lacquers and varnishes, silicone tubes;
- 8 Clothing / textiles;
- Packaging made from a mixture of materials that cannot be separated (a layer of plastic film with a layer of aluminium film, kraft packaging with a waterproof plastic membrane, etc.), such as pouches for drinks, compote or wet pet food, crisp tubes, etc.;
- Packaging with at least one of the hazard pictograms (acute toxicity, health hazard, risk of infection, corrosive products, etc.) shown below:







- 8 Electrical and electronic devices;
- 8 Packaging with a child safety cap;

**WHERE?** Where should you put your waste?

#### You can dispose of your PMD packaging:

- In the blue commercial / pro bag. Only if you have a blue bag commercial contract with our Agency.
- In the blue container. Only if you have a blue container commercial contract with our Agency.
- At our Recypark accessible to professionals. See <u>rates</u>, rules and practical information in this document or on the website's <u>Recypark</u> page.

HOW? How should you present your waste?

## Some rules for "PMD packaging":

- PMD packaging must be properly emptied, drained or scraped clean of its contents.
- ✓ For the collection of PMD packaging in bags, the use of bags other than the blue commercial / pro bag provided for this purpose is prohibited.
- ☑ Please remove plastic films that cover the whole of bottles, trays or containers and dispose of them separately in the blue commercial / pro bag.
- Flatten the plastic bottles to reduce their width (not their height) and replace the cap.
- ☑ Do not nest packaging items inside one another and do not pre-pack your PMD packaging waste in tied bags.
- Don't attach anything to the outside of the blue commercial / pro bag.
- **MD** packaging must have a maximum volume of eight litres (8 L).
- ☑ Bags should be a maximum of fifteen kilograms (15 kg).
- ✓ PMD packaging may be placed loose in the container. If you wish to use blue bags in the container, these must be commercial / pro bags.
- ☑ To be accepted for collection, containers must be easy for our teams to handle. It is important to consider their weight and where to leave them. A container that is too heavy, left on cobbles or gravel, or needs to be lifted off a curb may be impossible to collect, so pay attention to these details when preparing your containers for collection.



## **FURTHER INFORMATION**

Following the introduction of the European Single Use Plastics (SUP) Directive, the Brussels-Capital Region and Brussels Environment have decided to take packaging prevention a step further, in particular by launching the **new Packaging Facilitator service to give all public and professional bodies free assistance with the introduction of sustainable packaging systems**. ## 2.3. FOOD OR KITCHEN WASTE

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

## Waste authorized in the "Food or kitchen waste" category :

Food or kitchen waste originating from the normal running of a business, i.e. waste that is similar in nature and composition to waste originating from households.

- Meal leftovers / leftovers on plates (including leftover meat and fish);
- ✓ Leftover bread dough from bakeries in any quantity;
- ✓ Fruit and vegetable peel;
- Confectionery without its packaging;
- ✓ Coffee grounds;
- Tea bags made of paper only;
- ✓ Paper towels used to clear up food leftovers only;
- Paper tissues and napkins (unless you have caught COVID-19, throw them away after use in the fuchsia commercial / pro bag or the black container for residual waste);
- Expired foods (without their packaging).

## Waste refused in the "Food or kitchen waste" category:

- 8 Non-food waste, even if biodegradable;
- 8 Compostable / biodegradable packaging;
- ⊗ Green / garden waste;
- 8 Inert waste (soil, stone, glass, etc.);
- S Toxic waste;
- Liquid food waste such as soup, oil (see <u>"Oils"</u>), dairy products, etc.;
- Waste of animal or non-animal origin that is rejected for public health reasons (cat 1, cat 2, FASFC-rejected);

- 8 Soap and cleaning product residue;
- 8 Food supplements;
- Medications;
- 8 Flour;
- Oiapers / nappies;
- 8 Wood ash;
- Shells: eggs, nuts, oysters, mussels, etc.;
- 8 Litters, even if biodegradable;
- 8 Bones, carcasses and fish bones;
- 8 Fruit stones.

WHERE? Where should you put your waste?

## You can dispose of your "Food or kitchen waste":

- In the orange commercial / pro bag. Only if you have an orange bag commercial contract with our Agency.
- In the small orange bin Optional for commercial clients. Usually a container will better suit your needs.
- In the orange container. Only if you have an orange container commercial contract with our Agency.





#### HOW? How should you present your waste?

#### Some rules for "Food or kitchen waste":

- ✓ Food or kitchen waste is refused at Recypark → See <u>"Waste not accepted from professionals".</u>
- ☑ For the collection of food or kitchen waste in bags, the use of bags other than the orange commercial / pro bag provided for this purpose is prohibited.
- ✓ The small twenty-five litre (25 L) orange bin: you must use the orange commercial / pro bag sold exclusively by us. The bag must always be tied securely in the small orange bin. Our collection teams will take your bag away and leave your bin on the pavement so that you can reuse it for the next collection.
- ✓ The large one hundred and forty litre (140 L) and two hundred and forty litre (240 L) containers: you can put your food waste loose in the orange container provided to you on the basis of your collection contract with us. However, for reasons of hygiene and cleanliness, we recommend that you put your food waste in a rubbish bag before it goes into the orange container. The bag must either be one of our orange commercial / pro bags or a colourless transparent bag: if not, it will be considered non-compliant for the collection of food or kitchen waste.
- ☑ Bags should be a maximum of fifteen kilograms (15 kg).
- ✓ To be accepted for collection, containers must be easy for our teams to handle. It is important to consider their weight and where to leave them. For example, a container that is too heavy, left on cobbles or gravel, or needs to be lifted off a curb may be impossible to collect, so pay attention to these details when preparing your containers for collection.

## FURTHER INFORMATION

Do you produce food waste and would like to recycle it better and reduce your collection costs at the same time? **The Brussels Environment Professional Biowaste Facilitator** is there to provide expert advice and answer your questions. ## 2.4. GREEN OR GARDEN WASTE

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

Waste authorized in the "Green or garden waste" category:

Biodegradable garden waste, i.e. plant waste originating from the normal maintenance of gardens and terraces by a business, i.e. waste that is similar in nature and composition to waste originating from households.

- Branches (maximum diameter 8 cm and maximum length 1.5 m);
- ✓ Dead leaves;
- ✓ Wilted flowers;
- ✓ Weeds;
- ✓ Plants;
- Florist waste (diseased flowers/plants with pesticides/parasites);
- ✓ Hedge trimmings;
- ✓ Shrub trimmings;
- ✓ Grass cuttings (accepted for collection);
- ✓ Wood chips;
- ✓ Bark;
- ✓ Tree stumps / logs / trunks (maximum diameter 30 cm and maximum length 2 m)
   → Only in Recypark.

## Waste refused in the "Green or garden waste" category:

- ⊗ Grass cuttings (refused at Recypark);
- Soil;
- 8 Sand;
- 8 Animal faeces;
- 8 Pebbles;
- 8 Gravel and chippings;
- 8 Bricks and brick fragments;
- Slabs;
- Scrap metal;

- ⊗ Paper → See <u>"Paper and cardboard</u> waste";
- Branches (more than 8 cm in diameter or 1.5 m in length);
- Tarpaulins, wire mesh, fence posts, cement or plastic edging;
- Tree stumps / logs / trunks (more than 30 cm in diameter or 2 m in length).

WHERE? Where should you put your waste?

You can dispose of your "Green or garden waste":

- In the green commercial / pro bag. Only if you have a green bag commercial contract with us.
- At our Recypark accessible to professionals. See <u>rates</u>, rules and practical information in this document or on the website's <u>Recypark</u> page.





#### HOW? How should you present your waste?

#### Some rules for "Green or garden waste":

- For green or garden waste and garden wood, see <u>"Sorted waste for which payment is required</u> <u>from professionals"</u>.
- ☑ Waste such as "Grass cuttings" is refused at Recypark  $\rightarrow$  See <u>"Waste not accepted from</u> professionals".
- ☑ For the collection of green or garden waste in bags, the use of bags other than the green commercial / pro bag provided for this purpose is prohibited.
- ☑ Branches with a maximum diameter 8 cm and a maximum length of 1.5 m can be presented for collection in the bundles tied together with a biodegradable tie to make them easy to pick up.
- ☑ Tied bundles must be made easy to handle: the maximum bag and bundle weight is fifteen kilograms (15 kg).

## FURTHER INFORMATION

Real Christmas trees: these can be put out on the pavement on the day you put out your green or garden waste or taken to our Recypark accessible to professionals. Be sure to remove the pot and all decorations, and leave the crosspiece.

Warning: your artificial / plastic tree is a professional bulky waste item.



## 2.5. GLASS WASTE

There are three types of glass. It is important to distinguish them, because they are not all recyclable:

- 1. **Hollow glass:** glass bottles and jars, either whole or in fragments. The glass may be transparent or coloured. Hollow glass is almost endlessly recyclable without loss of quality.
- 2. **Flat glass:** as its name suggests, this type of glass is flat. It may or may not be recyclable.
- 3. **Hazardous glass:** includes all categories of glass that have been in contact with chemicals or toxic products, laboratory products or medicines. This glass must be stored separately.

## WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

## Waste authorized in the "Glass waste" category:

Transparent or non-transparent glass waste, whether colourless or coloured, originating from the normal running of a business, i.e. waste that is similar in nature and composition to waste originating from households.

- Hollow food glass and jars without food remains, provided any gravure printing does not contain colour.
- ✓ Authorized glass packaging waste that has been broken (bottles, jars, flasks, etc.) can be included as long as it represents a minority of the glass waste.

## Waste refused in the "Glass waste" category:

- ✓ Tubes;
- ✓ Needles;
- ✓ Borosilicate glass;
- Laboratory glass and medical packaging;
- Glass stoppers and packaging items;
- ✓ Lamps (light fixtures, bulbs, neon lights and tubes);
- Drinking glasses and glassware (their chemical composition is not the same);
- ✓ Glass containing lead;
- ✓ Vitroceramic glass (stove glass, Pyrex, glazing from wood burners, ovens, microwaves or hob)
   → See <u>"Bulky professional waste"</u>;
- ✓ Pottery, porcelain, ceramics, terracotta (plates, cups, etc.);
- Bottles that have contained chemicals;
- Bottles from hospitals and similar waste still containing liquids;
- ✓ Plastic lids, caps, capsules, tubes → See <u>"PMD waste";</u>
- Deliberately crushed glass (prohibited due to weight, high density);
- ✓ Flat glass (mirrors, panes, laminated glass (windscreens), etc.) → See <u>"Flat glass"</u>;
- ✓ Glass resistant to high temperatures (oven dishes, etc.);
- ✓ Opaline and crystal (opaline bottle, wine glasses, etc.).

WHERE? Where should you put your waste?





## You can dispose of your transparent coloured or non-coloured glass waste:

- In the green container. Only if you have a green container commercial contract with us.
- At our Recypark accessible to professionals. See <u>rates</u>, rules and practical information in this document or on the website's Recypark page.



# You can dispose of your <u>non-transparent</u> coloured or non-coloured glass waste, as well as your broken glass waste:

- For small items only: in the fuchsia commercial / pro bag or the black container. Examples of small broken glass waste: drinking glasses, small mirrors, bottles, jars, flasks, etc. Only incandescent (ordinary) and halogen bulbs may be put in the fuchsia commercial / pro bag or the black container.
- For small and large items: at our Recypark accessible to professionals and/or via our professional waste removal service (on a quotation basis).
   Examples of large broken glass waste: large mirrors, panes, etc.
   Energy-saving bulbs and LED lamps may be taken to a <u>Recypark</u> or collected by our professional waste removal service.
   Fluorescent tubes (neon lights) are only accepted via our professional waste removal service (contact us at pro@arp-gan.be).

## HOW? How should you present your waste?

Some rules for "Glass waste":

- Glass waste from professionals must not go into the bottle banks, which are for citizens without a collection contract.
- Glass waste must have lids, tops or caps removed and be emptied of its contents.
- Please carefully wrap any sharp objects or packages to prevent injury to our personnel.
- ☑ To be accepted for collection, containers must be easy for our teams to handle. It is important to consider their weight and where to leave them. For example, a container that is too heavy, left on cobbles or gravel, or needs to be lifted off a curb may be impossible to collect, so pay attention to these details when preparing your containers for collection.
- Glass waste may be presented as follows in large containers: white glass, coloured glass, mixed glass.
- ✓ Transparent glass bottles from hospitals and similar waste emptied of its contents can only be accepted for 'Glass waste' collection if it has not contained hazardous or potentially hazardous products.



## 2.6. RESIDUAL WASTE

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

## Waste authorized in the "Residual waste" category:

Residual waste originating from the normal activity of a business, i.e. residual waste that is similar in nature and composition to waste originating from households.



- Exclusively waste which does not have to be presented for selective collection under a legal or regulatory provision;
- ✓ Styrofoam food packaging → See <u>"Sorted waste for which payment is required from</u> professionals";
- ✓ Wet, dirty or damaged textiles;
- ✓ Incandescent bulbs;
- ✓ Inner tubes;
- Adhesive masking tape / sticky tape;
- ✓ Halogen lamps.

## Waste refused in the "Residual waste" category:

- Hazardous waste as defined in Article 3, 2° of the Ordinance of 14 June 2012 on hazardous waste (for more information, see <u>"Chemical and hazardous waste</u>");
- 8 Batteries;
- Ø Tyres;
- Mineral and edible oils;
- 8 Food fats;
- 8 Waste electrical or electronic equipment;
- Ø Drugs;
- 8 Vehicle parts;
- 8 Mattresses;
- 8 Clean, dry textiles in good condition;
- 8 Liquid waste from printing products;
- 8 Waste which presents an explosion or fire risk;
- Animal carcasses or parts;
- Waste from slaughterhouses and boning facilities, apart from food or kitchen waste and pet faeces;
- 8 Radioactive waste;
- 8 Waste containing asbestos (Eternit);
- ⊗ Hydrocarbon-based waste (roofing);
- 8 Construction, renovation and demolition waste;
- 8 Tree stumps / trunks;
- 8 Bulky items;
- 8 Non-combustible metal waste;
- Source Provide Prov
- 8 Waste that is accepted at a <u>Recypark</u> or in one of the ordinary selective collections;
- 8 Waste that can be taken by our professional waste removal service.



## WHERE? Where should you put your waste?

## You can dispose of your "Residual waste":

- In the fuchsia commercial / pro bag. Only if you have a fuchsia bag commercial contract with us.
- In the black container. Only if you have a black container commercial contract with us.

## HOW? How should you present your waste?

Some rules for "Residual waste":

- $\blacksquare$  Residual waste is refused at Recypark  $\rightarrow$  See <u>"Waste not accepted from professionals"</u>.
- Hangers (product) purchased separately go into the "Residual Waste" fraction. On the other hand, hangers sold with (under)garments or from the pressings, whether made entirely of plastic or entirely of metal, are considered to be packaging components and are therefore accepted in the "PMC Packaging" fraction.
- For the collection of residual waste in bags, the use of bags other than the fuchsia commercial / pro bag provided for this purpose is prohibited.
- ✓ You can put your loose residual waste in the black container. However, for reasons of hygiene and cleanliness, we recommend that you put your residual waste in a rubbish bag of your choice before it goes into the container.
- Please carefully wrap any sharp objects or packages to prevent injury to the employees of our Agency.
- ☑ Bags should be a maximum of fifteen kilograms (15 kg).
- ✓ To be accepted for collection, containers must be easy for our teams to handle. It is important to consider their weight and where to leave them. For example, a container that is too heavy, left on cobbles or gravel, or needs to be lifted off a curb may be impossible to collect, so pay attention to these details when preparing your containers for collection.



## 3. SORTING OF SPECIFIC WASTE ITEMS

## 3.1. LIGHT BULBS AND LAMPS

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

Waste authorized in the "Bulbs and lamps" category:

- ✓ Fluorescent tubes / neon lights accepted only via the professional waste removal service;
- ✓ Energy-saving lamps (energy-saving bulbs and tubes) max. 10 items;

## 3.2. WOOD

There are three types of wood. It is important to distinguish them, because they are not all recyclable. They are therefore treated separately:

- Wood A → reuse and recycling: <u>untreated</u>, <u>uncontaminated</u> and <u>non-hazardous</u> wood reused to make new products (e.g. pallets, boxes, solid wooden crates, <u>untreated</u> wood scraps/sawdust, beams, etc.).
- Wood B (or AB) → recycling: treated, uncontaminated and non-hazardous wood generally reused in an energy recovery circuit (e.g.: painted wood, varnished wood, glued wood, plywood, wood with textile, treated wood scraps/sawdust, etc.).
- 3. Wood C → incineration: <u>highly treated, contaminated or hazardous</u> wood. This is incinerated at special facilities (e.g.: railway sleepers, wooden electricity poles, impregnated wood, etc.).

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

Waste authorized in the "Wood" category:

- Treated and untreated wood;
- ✓ Boards;
- ✓ Doors;
- ✓ Beams;
- Disassembled furniture;
- ✓ Wooden frames;
- Chipboard and veneer wood, even if covered with plastic;
- Wooden shutters;
- ✓ MDF (medium density fibreboard);
- Laminate flooring;
- ✓ Wooden flooring;
- ✓ Tree stumps / trunks (max. diameter 30 cm and max. length 2 m)  $\rightarrow$  Only in Recypark.

- Waste refused in the "Wood" category:
  - 8 Rotten wood (not recycled but intended for thermal recovery) → See "Bulky professional waste";
  - 8 Chemical and hazardous waste;
  - ⊗ Creosote-treated wood;
  - 8 Wood impregnated with / stained by oil;
  - 8 Pesticides or wood protection products;
  - 8 Railway sleepers;
  - 8 Natural Christmas trees → See <u>"Green or garden waste"</u>;
  - ⊗ Artificial / plastic Christmas trees → See "Bulky professional waste";
  - 8 Tree stumps / trunks (more than 30 cm in diameter or 2 m in length)
    - $\rightarrow$  See <u>"Waste not accepted from professionals"</u>.

## HOW? How should you present your waste?

Some rules for "Wood" waste:

- ✓ For sawdust, frames, doors, shutters and beams, see <u>"Sorted waste for which payment is required"</u>.
- ✓ For optimal recycling of the wood waste mentioned above and for the processing of wooden planks more than sixty centimetres (60 cm) long, as well as entire small items of furniture measuring less than one metre (1 m) per side, you should preferably take the wood to one of the Brussels Recypark accessible to professionals.
- ☑ The different types of wood (simple wood, treated wood, rotten wood) must be sorted separately into specific containers at the Recypark.
- ✓ For the wood category, please specify the type of wood: Wood A (pallets), Wood B (mixed wood, bulky wood) or Wood C (chemically treated wood not collected via our professional waste removal service on quotation, can only be taken to a Recypark).

## FURTHER INFORMATION

Real Christmas trees: these can be put out on the pavement on the day you put out your green or garden waste or taken to our <u>Recypark</u> accessible to professionals. Be sure to remove the pot and all decorations, and leave the crosspiece.

Warning: your artificial / plastic tree is a professional bulky waste item.

- ✓ Cobblestones;
- ✓ Roof tiles.

- Ø Plaster, plasterboard sheets or tiles;
- 8 Gyproc;
- 8 Asbestos (Eternit);
- Solution Fibre cement;

- 8 Roofing materials;

- ✓ Present your waste without any other wood, plastic or metal waste (e.g. toilets should be presented without plastic seat or flush mechanism, sinks should be presented without taps, etc.).
- A maximum of twenty bags (20) may be brought to a Recypark.
- A maximum of twenty kilograms (20 kg) per bag measuring 50 x 80 cm.



## 3.6. CHEMICAL AND HAZARDOUS WASTE

## Hazardous waste as defined in Article 3, 2° of the Ordinance of 14 June 2012:

Hazardous waste: any waste that presents one or more of the hazardous properties listed below:

114	"Evaluative": autotanage and propagations that are evaluate if summarial to a flower of the tank
H1	<b>"Explosive":</b> substances and preparations that can explode if exposed to a flame or that are
	more sensitive to shock or friction than dinitrobenzene.
H2	"Oxidising agent": substances and preparations that present a strongly exothermic reaction in
	contact with other substances, particularly flammable substances.
H3-A	"Highly flammable":
	- substances and preparations in liquid state (including extremely flammable liquids) with a flash

	a source of ignition and that continue to burn or be consumed after the ignition source has been

- ✓ Dyes, nail polish;
- ✓ Lighters;
- ✓ Fire extinguishers;
- ✓ X-rays;
- ✓ Food / frying fat and oil (via <u>Valorfrit</u>);
- ✓ All aerosols except for empty cosmetic and food aerosols → See <u>"PMD waste"</u>;
- ✓ Perfumes;

- Batteries (via <u>Bebat</u>);
- Medical products;
- ✓ Thermometers;
- Articles for cars;
- Paints, varnishes and sealants;
- Printing products;
- Bulbs separated by type, compact fluorescent lamps ('energy-saving'), fluorescent tubes / neon lights and LED lamps (via <u>Recupel</u>).

## Waste refused in the "Chemical and hazardous waste" category:

- Optimize Potentially explosive products;
- 8 Potentially radioactive products (including uranyl acetate);
- ⊗ Infectious products (clinical waste);
- 8 Potentially infectious products (probes, tubing, bags, etc.);
- 8 Bacteriological waste;
- ⊗ Waste containing asbestos.

#### HOW? How should you present your waste?

#### Some rules for "Chemical and hazardous waste":

- ✓ Professionals may not take their chemical and hazardous waste to ProxyChimik (accessible to citizens only) or to a Recypark → See <u>"Waste not accepted from professionals"</u>.
- Chemicals must be in their original, tightly closed packaging (not loose in a plastic bag). If there is no original packaging, write the name of the product clearly on the packaging.
- ☑ Also hand in the empty packaging of professional chemicals.
- Hand in energy-saving light bulbs, fluorescent tubes / neon lights and LED lamps in a plastic bag to keep them separate from other waste.
- Separate liquid materials from solid materials.
- ☑ Do not mix materials together.
- ✓ Hazardous waste must be presented in specific containers which are in good condition and easy to access and handle.
- ✓ Fluorescent tubes and x-rays must be presented for collection without their individual packaging. In all cases, waste presenting a specific hazard during handling (peroxides, cyanides, sodium, phosphorus, acids, alkalis, etc.) must be isolated from other chemical waste and clearly identified.



#### 3.7. CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION AND DEMOLITION WASTE

## WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

Any item physically attached to your business or commercial premises is, generally speaking, considered to be construction, renovation or demolition waste. However, two categories of waste should be distinguished:

Waste authorized in the "Inert construction, renovation and demolition waste" category:

- ✓ Rubble;
- ✓ Bricks;
- ✓ Brick fragments;
- ✓ Pebbles;
- ✓ Stones;
- ✓ Floor tiles;
- ✓ Slabs;

- ✓ Roof tiles;
- ✓ Concrete;
- ✓ Bond stone;
- ✓ Cement:
- ✓ Plaster (scraps, Gyproc type boards and ceilings).
- Waste authorized in the "Other construction, renovation and demolition waste" category:
  - ✓ Treated and untreated wood;
  - ✓ Wooden, metal or plastic doors;
  - ✓ Wooden, metal or plastic frames;
     ✓ Wooden, metal or plastic frames;
  - ✓ Wooden, metal or plastic shutters;
- ✓ Gutters and pipes;
- Floor coverings;
- Bathroom fixtures.

## Waste refused in the "Construction, renovation and demolition waste" category:

- 8 Roof covering materials (roofing felt / Derbigum).
- 8 Asbestos (Eternit).

WHAT? What waste should be sorted in this category?

Waste authorized in the "Professional electrical and electronic waste" category:

✓	Large household appliances: refrigerated counters, large photocopiers, vending machines,											
	large	coffee	machines,	washing	machines,	dryers,	dishwashers,	hoods,	ovens,	stoves,		
refrigerators, freezers, etc.												

- ✓ Small household appliances: vacuum cleaners, toasters, small coffee machines, hair dryers, waffle irons, mixers, microwave ovens, fryers, kettles, irons, electric garden or DIY tools, etc.
- Multimedia devices: computers, touchscreen tablets, computer screens, television screens, radios, hi-fi systems, mobile phones, MP3 players, cameras, video recorders, alarm clocks, etc.
- Bulbs separated by type: compact fluorescent bulbs ('economy bulbs'), fluorescent tubes ('economy tubes'), LED lamps and incandescent bulb ('ordinary bulbs'), etc.
- ✓ **Lighting:** floor lamps, desk lamps, chandeliers, lanterns, etc.

## Waste authorized in the "Bulky professional waste" category:

Bulky professional waste is waste from your professional activity that cannot be collected in bags due to its nature, weight or size. See <u>"Sorted waste for which payment is required"</u>.

- ✓ Textiles;
- ✓ Furniture and decorative furnishings (tables, armchairs, carpets, etc.);
- Vitroceramic glass (stove glass, Pyrex, glazing from wood burners, ovens, microwaves or hob);
- ✓ Artificial / plastic Christmas trees;
- Rotten wood (not recycled but intended for thermal recovery);
- ✓ Plastic frames;
- Plastic shutters;
- ✓ Foam, spring or latex mattresses.

## Waste refused in the "Bulky professional waste" category:

However, there are three types of waste that require specific treatment:

- 1. Chemical products.
- 2. Large electrical and electronic appliances (refrigerated counters, large photocopiers, vending machines, coffee machines).
- 3. Inert waste (rubble, bricks, stones, breeze-blocks....).
- 8 Chemical waste;
- 8 Inert waste;
- 8 Empty paint cans;
- 8 Badly worn-out mattresses;
- 8 Mattresses in pieces;
- 8 Burnt mattresses;
- Mattresses whose materials cannot be recycled (straw, animal hair, etc.);
- Mattresses whose mechanical strength is seriously compromised;
- O Damp / visibly wet mattresses;

- Mattresses that may present risks for the personnel responsible for handling them (pointed or sharp parts, etc.);
- Mattresses with large areas of deep wetness or presenting very clear signs of fungal proliferation;
- Mattresses that are excessively soiled, degraded or damaged or with large areas in an advanced state of deterioration.

✓ Products for cleaning, DIY, gardening, printing, the car, etc.

## Waste authorized in the "Vegetable oils" category:

Vegetable oil is a liquid or substance extracted from plants.

- ✓ Food / frying oil (via <u>Valorfrit</u>);

## Waste refused in the "Oils" category:

8 Other substances not listed under "Authorized waste".

  - 8 Mattresses in pieces;

  - 8 Damp / visibly wet mattresses or presenting very clear signs of fungal proliferation;

# 4.2. CONTAINERS



We hire out containers of various sizes for the collection of different categories of waste. Container hire arrangements can be tailored to your specific needs in terms of volume and collection frequency.

#### Here is a non-exhaustive list of important points regarding collection containers:

- Your containers must be on the kerbside only during collection times. Please return them to your premises after each collection.
- The containers made available by Bruxelles-Propreté Pro comply with the requirements of the loaders and trucks used to mechanically lift and empty them.
- Please only use:
  - $\rightarrow$  The blue container for <u>PMD waste</u>;
  - $\rightarrow$  The yellow container for <u>Paper and cardboard waste</u>;
  - $\rightarrow$  The green container for <u>Glass waste</u>;
  - $\rightarrow$  The orange container for <u>Food or kitchen waste</u>;
  - → The black containers for <u>Residual waste</u>;
  - $\rightarrow$  The <u>special rigid yellow container</u> for syringes.
- If there is prior written agreement in place with Bruxelles-Propreté Pro, you have permission to use your own containers as long as they comply with the service provider's same requirements and with the rules on volumes, dimensions, colour depending on the waste category, the lid, the wheels, etc.
- To be accepted for collection, containers must be easy for our teams to handle. It is important to consider their weight and where to leave them. For example, a container that is too heavy, left on cobbles or gravel, or needs to be lifted off a curb may be impossible to collect, so pay attention to these details when preparing your containers for collection.

- The use of a compactor or press to increase the load of waste in a container is prohibited.
- Your containers must be clearly identifiable in order to differentiate them from those of neighbouring customers or apartment blocks.
- Your containers must be presented for collection with the lid closed and must be cleaned regularly by you (mainly in the case of food waste, glass, etc.).
- If you wish to lock your containers, please use coded containers and provide us with the combination to open them. We do not accept key-operated padlocks.



 Concerning hazardous or potentially hazardous waste, please follow the safety rules relating to the containers to be used for bringing in your waste or having it collected. For more information, see <u>"Chemical and hazardous waste</u>".

### 4.3. BAGS



We sell commercial bags, also called "pro bags", of various volumes (30 L, 50 L, 60 L or 80 L) depending on the different types of waste you generate.

#### Here is a non-exhaustive list of important points regarding PRO collection bags:

- Commercial / pro bags are exclusively sold by Bruxelles-Propreté Pro.
- For the collection of waste in bags, the use of bags other than the commercial / pro bags provided for this purpose is prohibited. Please only use:
  - $\rightarrow$  The blue pro bag for <u>PMD waste</u>;
  - $\rightarrow$  The yellow pro bag for <u>Paper and cardboard waste</u>;
  - $\rightarrow$  The green pro bag for <u>Green or garden waste</u>;
  - → The orange pro bag for Food or kitchen waste;
  - $\rightarrow$  The fuchsia pro bag for <u>Residual waste</u>.
- Please note that it is prohibited to use the white bag, which is specifically reserved for the collection
  of residual waste for citizens who do not have commercial contracts. Professionals who have
  arranged a collection contract with us are required to make exclusive use of the fuchsia commercial
  / PRO bag for the collection of their residual waste. Professionals who continue to use white bags
  are liable to penalties and fines. The same applies to the use of other colours of bags which also
  have the "PRO" logo as they are intended for our professional customers.
- Please present your commercial / pro bags closed for collection, so that their contents don't spill out and they are easy to handle.
- The maximum weight of a bag is fifteen kilograms (15 kg).

# 4.4. LOOSE ITEMS

#### Here is a non-exhaustive list of important points regarding loose items for collection:

- Paper and cardboard waste must be clean, dry, free from residue, free from plastic film.
- Pieces of cardboard / newspapers that do not fit in the yellow commercial / pro bag can be folded and tied securely. It is preferable to use cotton, hemp, jute or sisal string for this. Do not use plastic ties.
- Paper and cardboard waste may also be put out for collection in cardboard boxes. Paper and cardboard waste must not spill from the box that is used.
- As far as possible, remove stickers, tape or adhesive from cardboard before putting it out for collection.
- For the safety of the teams responsible for collection and for more efficient handling during collection rounds, ensure that the compacted cardboard bales and cardboard boxes are easy to handle and transport, i.e. of a reasonable size and weight. Use two medium-sized bales instead of one that is excessively heavy.
- The maximum weight of a bag, bale or box is fifteen kilograms (15 kg).
- If styrofoam is presented loose, it must be presented without cardboard and without plastic film. It is advisable to tie the styrofoam together so that it does not fly away.
- Styrofoam can also be taken to our <u>Recypark</u> accessible to professionals.



#### Here is a non-exhaustive list of important points regarding large containers and compactors:

- Waste put out in large containers / compactors must be loose.
- For the wood category, please specify the type of wood:
  - $\rightarrow$  Wood A (pallets);
  - $\rightarrow$  Wood B (mixed wood, bulky wood);
  - → Wood C (chemically treated wood, not collected via professional waste removal, to be brought to Recypark only).
- It is prohibited to put any waste in a large container and/or compactor other than waste that meets the specifications and types of waste defined by the company that owns the container and/or compactor, i.e. waste similar in nature and composition to household waste.
- It is prohibited to leave waste next to a large container and/or compactor.
- Large containers and/or compactors cannot be filled any higher than the side edges (maximum height = side height).
- The placing and removal of large containers and/or compactors, which may take no more than thirty minutes (30 min) in each case, take place in the morning between 7.00 and 12.00 and/or in the afternoon between 14.00 and 17.00, by appointment made with Bruxelles-Propreté Pro. If, due to your installations, the work involved in placing and/or removing a large container and/or a compactor is expected consistently to exceed thirty minutes (30 min), the expected amount of time can be agreed and indicated in <u>Annex I</u>. If the placing and/or removal exceeds this duration of thirty minutes (30 min), or more if agreed in <u>Annex I</u>, additional costs will be charged as indicated in the contract or the quotation.
- You must be duly represented at the time of placement and removal of containers / compactors. You must notify our sales team in advance of the person who will represent you. Failing this, our team will not proceed with the placement and/or removal;
- Please contact the competent authorities to reserve a parking space large enough for the placement and/or collection of the large container or compactor. Also take the necessary measures in terms of authorisation, signage and safety (e.g. setting up metal markers in the ground).



# 5. COLLECTION LOCATIONS

#### Here is a non-exhaustive list of important points regarding the collection locations for your waste:

- In the absence of specific provisions to the contrary, which must be mentioned in <u>Annex I</u>, your different waste\* streams must be separated and grouped by type and put out on the pavement or verge next to the road, building front, hedge, fence or property line, in the immediate vicinity of the property's entrance or garage door. Your waste must not encroach on neighbouring properties or obstruct users of the pavement or road system.
- The waste\* may not be left within a radius of one metre (1 m) around public litter bins, to ensure that these bins remain accessible to citizens and employees of Bruxelles-Propreté Pro.
- In the event that roads are inaccessible to the collection vehicle used by Bruxelles-Propreté Pro (courtyards, dead ends, private roads etc.), the waste\* streams must be separated and grouped by type and put out on the pavement or verge of the nearest road accessible to the vehicle or at the collection point designated by Bruxelles-Propreté Pro, with the same precautions being taken.
- To be accepted for collection, containers must be easy for our teams to handle. It is important to consider their weight and where to leave them. For example, a container that is too heavy, left on cobbles or gravel, or needs to be lifted off a curb may be impossible to collect, so pay attention to these details when preparing your containers for collection.
- A sufficiently large parking space must be provided by you for bulky waste / large containers in front of your building; this space must be clear and accessible for the truck at the time of loading.

# 6. PUTTING OUT & COLLECTION TIMES

# 6.1. FOR ORDINARY WASTE

Unless specific stipulations to the contrary are expressly set out in <u>Annex I</u>, or certain areas are subject to alternative schedules, the so-called 'Standard' schedules are as follows:

#### For collections that take place in the morning (AM) between 5.30 and 14.00:

 $\rightarrow$  Waste\* should be put out the day before collection between 18.00 and 24.00.

#### For collections that take place in the afternoon (PM) between 12.30 and 21.00:

 $\rightarrow$  Waste\* should be put out on the morning of collection before 12.00.

#### For collections that take place in the evening (NOC) between 20.00 and 2.00:

 $\rightarrow$  Waste\* should be put out between 18.00 and 20.00 on the day on which the collection round starts.

\* Bags, containers (volumes expressed in litres), crates, packages and/or bundles.

### **6.2. FOR SPECIFIC WASTE ITEMS**

- The collection date and time are organised based on an appointment made in advance with our sales team.
- You can put out your waste no more than one hour before the collection time slot indicated by Bruxelles-Propreté Pro.
- You must be duly represented at the time of removal of your waste. Please notify our sales team in advance of the person who will represent you. Failing this, our team will not proceed with removal.
- If the collection vehicle does not come or some or all of the waste is not removed, you are required to bring the waste back into your premises and, if necessary, resubmit a collection request to our sales team.



# 7. BRINGING WASTE TO A RECYPARK

We are constantly looking for new recycling channels to encourage the circular economy. This both preserves material and energy resources and contributes directly and indirectly to the fight against climate change.

You are allowed to bring your waste to the Brussels Recypark accessible to professionals – subject to their rules and prices – with the exception of waste that appears in the list of <u>"Waste not accepted from</u> professionals".

# 7.1. RECYPARK REGULATIONS

#### Terms and payment

- ✓ You must be domiciled in the Brussels Region and present your identity card.
- Provide the necessary documents to access the Recypark as a professional (example : presentation of an official document with all the data of your company).
- Your invoice must be requested on site before payment.
- Payment may only be made by bank card (no cash).


#### Waste sorting and disposal

- ✓ Only one visit per day and per vehicle.
- To see the list of free sorted waste and sorted waste subject to charges, please refer to the <u>"Rates"</u> section below.
- ✓ You must sort your waste into the right categories beforehand.
- You must arrange the categories of waste so that they can easily be checked.
- The vehicle may only contain waste intended for the Recypark.
- Access will be refused to vehicles containing unsorted or refused waste.
- Certain types of waste are not accepted from professionals. Please refer to the <u>"Waste</u> refused from professionals" section below.
- You must unload your own waste and transfer it into the appropriate containers yourself.

In case of doubt about the origin of the waste, or in the event of a possible dispute, our staff is authorized to register the relevant data from your identity card.



#### Vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians

- You must use a vehicle with a total ground weight < 3.5t.</li>
- ✓ Cyclists are allowed.
- ✓ Vehicles with a trailer and vehicles over 1.85 meters high must go to Recypark Humanité.
- Pedestrians are allowed as long as they are not motorists who leave their vehicle in the queue or in the visible surroundings to enter the Recypark on foot.

#### Behavior

- ✓ Objects / waste may not be retrieved.
- No aggressive behaviour will be tolerated. In the event of insults or threats (verbal or physical), Bruxelles-Propreté reserves the right to refuse your waste and to take legal action.
- ✓ Please do not clean your vehicle on site after unloading.

# 7.2. SORTED WASTE FOR WHICH PAYMENT IS REQUIRED FROM PROFESSIONALS

Per vehicle and per day:

• More than 3 m³ of waste, all categories combined: €121 incl. VAT

Less than 3m<sup>3</sup>, free for the following sorted waste:

- ✓ Paper;
- ✓ Cardboard;
- PMD packaging;
- ✓ Glass bottles, jars and flasks;
- ✓ Small / large household electrical appl.;
- ✓ Ferrous and non-ferrous metals;
- ✓ Corks;

Less than 3m<sup>3</sup>, payment required for the following sorted waste:

- **Roof covering materials (roofing felt / Derbigum)** → Return to the supplier if possible or contact <u>Bruxelles Environnement</u> for more information on 02/775.75.75.
- Medicines and medical waste → You can get rid of this at your pharmacist or via our professional waste removal service: ask for a chemicals quotation. Send us your list of waste items via pro@arpgan.be or by fax to 02/780.28.38.
